

BY -LAW #1009
OF THE
TOWN OF ST. PAUL

A By-Law of the Municipal Council of the Town of St. Paul, in the Province of Alberta, in the Province of Alberta to amend Traffic By-Law #779.

WHEREAS, it is deemed expedient to amend the Traffic By-Law.

Now Therefore under the authority and subject to the provisions of the Highway Traffic Act and amendments thereto and by virtue of all other powers it enables the Council of the Town of St. Paul hereby assembled enacts as follows:

By-Law #779 is hereby amended as follows:

SECTION 6 - PARKING IN RESIDENTIAL AREAS

FROM:

No person shall park any vehicle in excess of 3/4 ton rated capacity of any type of construction equipment or machinery, or any machine used in the process of farm or field husbandry on any highway in any area of the Town of St. Paul, which is zoned for any class of residential use. This section shall not apply to a vehicle being parked for the purpose of loading or unloading a commercial delivery or to any construction equipment or machinery being used in the course of construction or an improvement to any public or private property in the Town of St. Paul, always provided that such vehicle is located either in front of or across from or on the flankage of the property on which the improvement is being made.

TO:

No person shall park any vehicle in excess of 3/4 ton rated capacity or any type of construction equipment or machinery, or any machine used in the process of farm or field husbandry on any highway in any area of the Town of St. Paul, which is zoned for any class of residential use. This section shall not apply to a vehicle being parked for the purpose of loading or unloading a commercial delivery or to any construction equipment or machinery being used in the course of construction or an improvement to any public or private property in the Town of St. Paul, always provided that such vehicle is located either in front of or across from or on the flankage of the property on which the improvement is being made.

This By-Law shall come into affect on the final passing thereof.
